

Call for Applications for the Pamela and Scott Woodward Conservation Scholarship Academic Year 2021-22

The Pamela and Scott Woodward Conservation Scholarship was created by Tapteal Greenway in 2016. Tapteal Greenway is a nonprofit organization dedicated to promoting conservation, education and recreation along the lower Yakima River. This merit-based scholarship was created to further its education mission while recognizing the significant contributions by the Woodwards to Tapteal Greenway and the Tri-Cities community.

Eligibility requirements:

- The applicant must be a resident of Benton or Franklin County.
- The applicant must be a full-time high school senior entering their freshman year of college or a returning college student.
- Applicant must enroll as a full-time student in an accredited college or university in Washington State.
- Applicant must have a cumulative 3.0 GPA (on 4.0 scale).
- Applicant must have a demonstrated interest in conservation.

A single \$2,000 scholarship will be awarded.

(This scholarship is not available to relatives of the Woodward Scholarship Selection Committee or the family of Pamela and Scott Woodward.)

To apply, please provide the following:

Application Form (Attached).

Essay. Write an essay (500 to 1000 words) telling us about your interest in conservation and describe in detail an example of a conservation related activity or service project you were involved in.

References. Please include two reference letters with your application. These letters should be from people who know you through your academic or employment experience or your community leadership and participation. Please do not include relatives as references.

Transcript. Your full transcript from the school you are currently attending can be enclosed with your application or mailed directly to the Three Rivers Community Foundation.

Deadline: Applications will be accepted from <u>January 1 through April 30, 2021</u>. Send the fully completed application, plus letters of reference and school transcripts to:

Final Selection: The final selection process may include a personal interview with the scholarship selection committee. The selection is expected to be completed in June with notification to the award recipient by letter in July.

Payment: Payment of the scholarship award will be made directly to the institution in the recipient's name. Payment will be submitted following receipt of verification of enrollment.

Verification. I affirm that the information included with my application is true and accurate in all respects and that I intend to pursue a post-secondary degree. I understand that if selected, the awarding of funds is contingent upon my full-time enrollment in an accredited institution, and that the funds will be paid directly to the institution and used toward the cost of my education.
